Trip of a Lifetime By Tracy Hickman

After years of dreaming and planning, I finally was going to Idaho for a western elk hunt. My best friend, John Richards and I set out early on Thursday morning, October 1, 2020 to drive to the Blackfoot Mountains of Idaho, right across the Wyoming state line. I had weighed the pros and cons of driving versus flying and decided that driving would be best. We could pack as much as we wanted, and if we had a successful hunt, we would be able to pack all our meat in coolers to bring home. Since I had never driven across the United States, I also figured I might not ever have another opportunity to see these parts of the country.

The trip out took us five days and over 2,200 miles via highway 90. We took our time and got to see a lot beautiful sights. Trip highlights included going through Madison, WI, Badlands National Park, SD, seeing Wall Drug Store in SD, Mount Rushmore, and Yellowstone National Park. We got lucky enough to stay at a historic, rustic, frontier cabin at the Yellowstone Lodge. We continued through the Grand Tetons, Jackson Hole and finally to the Spike Camp in Blackfoot, ID.

There were a total of eight hunters at the camp. We slept in western wall tents which were quite comfortable. The camp provided a cook who served up some awesome food! We certainly did not go hungry. The nighttime temperatures would drop to the mid-20s, but during the day, it would climb up into the 60s. Day one of the hunt was on Tuesday, October 6th. My guide, Brennan, was a young man from Montana who was extremely experienced. He has hunted all over the world. The first thing he told me was, "forget everything you know about east coast deer hunting." Elk hunting involves a lot of walking up and down mountains, glassing, and waiting patiently. Then walking, glassing, and waiting some more...

We did see some elk the first day but nothing close. The second morning we were back at it and did not see anything, so it was back to camp for lunch and a quick nap. That afternoon, we spotted a nice bull over a thousand yards away, so we came up with a plan to try to close the distance. We hiked down one ridge and up another. My lungs were burning as I tried to keep up with Brennan. He, by the way, was half my age. When I finally caught up with Brennan at the top of the trail, he told me to get down because there was another bull 200 yards down below!

We slowly worked our way down and around the ridge top to within 160 yards of the bull. This bull was a nice 7x7. I will never forget how fast my heart was racing and the dryness of my mouth. Brennan was able to settle me down and told me to wait and not rush the shot. He cow called one time and was able to get the big bull to turn broadside. I pulled the trigger on my 7mm Rem Mag and hit him right behind the shoulder. The bull dropped instantly in its tracks! I couldn't believe the range of emotions that ran through me. It was a dream come true. The entire trip leading up to this moment had been an experience of a lifetime. Now here I was standing over this magnificent beast that until now, had only been in my dreams.

At this moment, I was glad I had hunted with an outfitter. Brennan called for assistance on his radio. We field dressed and loaded up the elk on a gator and headed back to camp. The outfitter took care of all the skinning, quartering and transport to the butcher. The meat would not be ready until Thursday. We packed everything up Thursday morning, said our goodbyes and headed back to Maryland via highway 80. My goal was to get home as soon as possible because the meat and hide were packed in dry ice and that would only last for so long. I brought home close to 400 pounds of elk meat!

Range Status

The range is currently open as usual for members to use. Please remember that every Friday is reserved for Special Activities. Before heading to the range, members should always check the Calendar of Events under the Events tab on the Chapter website for current range status information. Range use is occasionally limited due to training classes and other events.

The 200-yard berm improvements are still not complete. Until this work is completed, the 200-yard range is not available for use.

Any guest using the range must be supervised by a Chapter member with Range Safety Officer credentials. A fee of \$5.00 for each guest is to be paid at the donation box under the sign-in box. **Only one bench may be used by the member and guest.** The same guest may visit the range only two times a year. The guest fee and two-visit limit do not apply to the immediate family of members.
