
Board Meeting Reminder

CONSERVATION

The Conservation Committee met online August 8st, 2022 at 8:00pm via Zoom.

During the meeting we reviewed our Conservation Committee Mission Statement and Long Range Plan, received project reports, and introduced new business. Our September meeting is at the Chapter September 19, 2022 at 6pm for our Bluebird nesting box construction event.

Bluebird Nesting Box Construction event, 9/19/2022 6pm

The Conservation Committee is having a member event under the Chapter shooting pavilion on Monday evening September 19th at 6pm to assemble ten bluebird nesting boxes. Please join us for this important conservation program at the Izaak Walton League.




Construction materials will be present, and wood already cut up in "kits" to be glued and screwed together. Everyone needs to bring cordless drills to drill pilot holes and drive screws, screw driving bits, drill bit set, and some newspaper to put on top of the tables.

The Bluebird nesting boxes will be installed around the Chapter property to support the local Bluebird population per recommendation from the Maryland Ornithological Society. The Conservation Committee will organize rotations for maintenance and checking the boxes for brood populations. Data collected will be shared with the Maryland Ornithological Society and the Breeding Bird Atlas Program. You can support our Chapter conservation program through lending a hand assembling the nesting boxes, installing boxes, and/or joining the rotation in checking box status and reporting brood population data.

Eastern bluebirds are very common in farm fields and other open, rural areas where woods are found nearby. In the summer, Eastern bluebirds eat insects. They are favored residents of farms because they eat many insects that damage crops. Eastern bluebirds lay, on average, 5 eggs in early spring that hatch about 12 days later. Once the young are on their own, the Eastern bluebird parents will often raise one more brood before fall comes. By the 1950's and 1960's, the numbers of Eastern bluebirds dropped dramatically. In the early 1970's, the plight of the Eastern bluebird was recognized throughout the eastern United States and conservation programs were enacted to help restore their population.

Save Our Streams (S.O.S.) Program

Join our September water testing event at the Catoctin Creek Nature Center, Monday September 26th at 10am. Contact Stephen Meyer at <u>stephen.meyer7@gmail.com</u> or call 240-604-7280 for details and the current testing rotation. Frederick County Schools are closed on the 26th, so this is a good day to introduce students to environmental water testing of our local streams.

Testing in October will be conducted in Thurmont at Big Hunting Creek, and back at Catoctin Creek Nature Center in November. After November, we will resume testing in March.

IWLA Frederick Chapter #1 Save our Streams program provides testing and long-term water chemistry data on select streams in Frederick County Maryland. Future goals include continued stream monitoring for chemical contaminants, introduction of Salt Watch in the winter, and macroinvertebrate monitoring. The Izaak Walton League's Save Our Streams program is the only nationwide program training volunteers to protect waterways from pollution and bring information about water quality to their communities.

Currently, we plan to test through to November, then begin Salt Watch during the winter to determine the impact of road salt changing the salinity of our streams. Plan to help the IWLA in this

vital work supporting the League's strategic goal "To conserve, restore, and promote the sustainable use and enjoyment of our natural resources, including soil, air, woods, waters, and wildlife."
