CONSERVATION

Our Chapter is dedicated to supporting the Izaak Walton League's strategic goal "To conserve, restore, and promote the sustainable use and enjoyment of our natural resources, including soil, air, woods, waters, and wildlife."

Our monthly Conservation Committee meeting was held April 3, 2023 at the clubhouse. Next meeting is Monday, May 1, 2023 at 6pm. We will discuss lessons learned and review from our April events including the conservation presentation at Sabillasville Environmental School, and planning for May events including macro-invertebrate water testing (5/6), planting Swamp Milkweed in our pollinator garden, and our new Bluebird nesting box checking schedule.

New Conservation Community Partnership



The IWLA Frederick Chapter #1 has a new conservation partnership with <u>Sabillasville Environmental School (SES)</u>. SES provides elementary and middle school-aged children in Frederick County with a college and career focused instructional program that develops students' knowledge, reason, and self-expression with a focused curriculum on environmental learning. SES has partnered with Frederick Chapter #1 to collaborate on studying environmental issues and conservation education.

On Friday, April 28th, members of our Frederick Chapter#1 Conservation Committee, Steve Meyer and Chris Barrett, conducted their first in a series of presentations to the SES student body on the Izaak Walton League's <u>Save Our Streams (SOS)</u> program, presented our work, and shared our Chapter's discoveries and methods in stream water and macroinvertebrate testing. Future sessions will include conducting stream testing on the school grounds with SES students, teaching water testing methods and evaluation, analyzing data, and determining next steps in applying conservation principles. Chris and Steve's SOS presentation was well received, and SES faculty is very much in anticipation of their next visit.

Save our Streams Water Testing

Save Our Streams chemical and macroinvertebrate monitoring at Big Hunting Creek in Thurmont MD was postponed to May 6, 2023 at 10am. Observers are limited to two persons due to space limitations. IWLA Frederick Chapter #1 Save our Streams program provides testing and long-term water chemistry data on select streams in Frederick County Maryland. The Izaak Walton League's Save Our Streams program is the only nationwide program training volunteers to protect waterways from pollution and bring information about water quality to their communities.

Pollinator Garden

Two pollinator gardens on the Chapter property have been created to support our Mason Bee habitat program providing pollen as food for the Mason bees. Also, the Swamp Milkweed plants will provide breeding habitat for Monarch butterflies which are declining in population. Monarch butterflies prefer to lay eggs on Swamp Milkweed plants which provides food for their larva. Our intention is to cultivate a robust garden of milkweed plants and eventually have butterfly chrysalises that will bolster the Monarch population and can serve as instructional tools for students.







On Tuesday, April 25th, Steve Meyer, Chris Barrett, and Preston Wood installed a garden mesh fence around both gardens to protect the pollinator plants from the deer and other wildlife, yet still provide access to insects as well as Mason bees and Monarch butterflies. Bluebird Nesting Boxes



The Bluebird nesting season is underway. We are monitoring our Bluebird nesting boxes on a weekly basis looking for occupants noting broodsize and eventual indications of fledging. Our boxes around

the Chapter property and the pond are currently empty. But we will keep you posted on any nesting activity. We're looking to implement ways of attracting Bluebirds to the boxes. Ikes checking the Bluebird nesting boxes are Preston Wood, Steve Meyer, John Gallo, Al Manus, and Josh Phipps. If you would like to join in the rotation to check the Eastern Bluebird Nesting boxes, please contact Preston Wood (woodpreston@yahoo.com) to get on the rotation schedule. Commitment would be roughly once a month from now until September visiting each of the 10 boxes noting any occupancy and brood size and reporting data collected in the data binder.
