**IWLA Salt Watchers of the Month of March** - **Steve Meyer and Chris Barrett** Reprinted from the IWLA National Salt Watch Newsletter, 24 April 2024



Steve and Chris were recognized by IWLA National as Salt Watchers of the Month because of their efforts to bring Salt Watch monitoring to local schools in Maryland and through their Izaak Walton League chapter. Chris and Steve have been doing chemical and macroinvertebrate testing of several streams in Frederick County, MD, along with Salt Watch and Nitrate Watch.

In 2023 Chris and Steve presented the League's Save Our Streams program to students kindergarten through sixth grade at the newly established Frederick County Sabillasville Environmental Charter School. They covered water chemistry testing techniques in one session and macroinvertebrate analysis in the next. Most recently they were invited back to present the Salt Watch program in December.

Steve has been a resident of Frederick, Maryland, since 2017, and has lived in Maryland since the late 1960s. He retired in 2009. Currently, he is a member of the League's Frederick Chapter. He volunteers a great deal in conservation projects, including Save Our Streams, Salt Watch and Forest Stewardship. Steve also volunteers in the community and for the American Legion.

Chris has always been interested in conservation and protecting the environment. He established the first Earth Day celebration at his high school in April of 1970 and has been involved with many conservation initiatives throughout the years. Most notably, Chris became the Business Unit Manager for the Environmental, Health and Safety Training Division of the Bureau of National Affairs in 1983. Not only did he organize Earth Day and other conservation activities there, but he was also responsible for the development of the first eight-hour program designed to train employees how to handle, store and dispose of hazardous waste properly. Chris joined the League's Frederick Chapter in March of 2021 to pursue his continued interest in conservation and protecting the environment.

#### Chapter Cancellation and Closure Guidelines

The Chapter has new guidelines for Chapter closure due to inclement weather which were approved by the Board and voted on at the April 2024 Membership Meeting:

#### **Bluebird Nesting Box News**

While checking our nesting boxes, Frederick Chapter Ike Al Manus discovered a new bird family has moved into box #10. Although the eggs do not appear to be Eastern Blue Bird, our bird team thinks they may be from either a Black Caped Chickadee, Wren, Nuthatch, or Eastern Phoebe. The 2024 <u>Save Our Streams</u> (SOS) season has resumed at Ballenger Creek Park and at Tuscarora Creek near the C&O Canal occurring each month from March to November.

On April 29<sup>th</sup>, Chris Barrett, Steve Meyer, and new member Robert Vendemmia conducted chemical water tests at Tuscarora Creek near the C&O canal. This location is South of

the data center construction at the former Alcoa plant. The location for taking water samples is not ideal since there isn't much parking in the area and the banks are muddy and steep. As a result, we used samples collected in bottles which is not ideal. However, it is publicly accessible, and the team wanted to test a creek we suspect is compromised. Water quality at Tuscarora Creek was generally only fair as you can see from the test results below. Although there was excellent dissolved oxygen and transparency, the water was only fair in pH, and contained chloride, and nitrates. You can find all our water testing data on cleanwaterhub.org.

#### **Frederick Chapter #1 Forest Stewardship Program**



Two volunteers are needed to assist with forest stewardship on the chapter property. Primary duties include locating invasive plants, guiding work parties to selected areas of the property once or twice a year, and observing and reporting plant removal and herbicide application by workers. Later in 2024, volunteers are needed to help plan establishment

of food plots for turkey and deer in cleared areas. Numerous YouTube videos are available to help with training in forestry. We also have access to several books on the topic. If interested please attend a future Conservation meeting, held the first Monday each month at 6pm. All work earns points for conservation. The new Forest Stewardship Program has greatly expanded our potential for further conservation work. A healthy forest adds so much to the overall environment that we need only look to our own property to meet our mandate to preserve our water, land and air. The University of Maryland Extension Service offers several affordable online courses each spring and fall that involve forestry. If only a few members self-educated themselves in how to improve our woodland, we could set our chapter up for conservation successes for the foreseeable future.


